Marcin Kilanowski Ph.D., JD, LL.M. is an Assistant Professor at Nicolas Copernicus University. After completing his studies and research in philosophy and law at Nicolas Copernicus University, Utrecht University, Oxford University, and Harvard University where his achievements were recognized with the Faculty Prize, Prizes of the Ministry of Higher Education, Prizes for Young Scientist of The Foundation for Polish Science and the Prize of Stefan Batory Foundation for the best doctoral thesis Marcin was a visiting researcher and visiting scholar at John F. Kennedy Institute for North American Studies at Freie Universität Berlin, The Institute for Social Research at Johann Wolfgang Goethe-Universität, Frankfurt am Mine, Department of Philosophy at Harvard University, and Science-Po Ecole de Droit in Paris.

Marcin research focuses on development of democracy, civil society, global governance through redefining private-public dichotomy in philosophy, law and economics, and was supported by grants from Kosciuszko Foundation, The State Committee for Scientific Research, European Commission and French Government.

Besides previous work as a law tutor at Harvard College, teaching assistant at Institute of Global Law and Policy at Harvard Law School and present work at Nicolas Copernicus University he worked on development of Strategy for Regional Development and Regional Strategy for Development of Innovation for the new EU financial perspective 2014-2020 concerning transfer of knowledge, research and development, public-private partnerships as a model for strengthening innovation in business and in science. He also worked as a member of The Prime Minister of Poland Working Group on Corporate Social Responsibility and expert as well a leader of numerous European projects concerned with development of social dialogue, cooperation between private and public partners, and supporting adaptability of workers and employers to socio-economic changes while being a Vice-President of Confederation of Private Employers LEWIATAN.

As not only an academic but also a social entrepreneur that helps to develop human capital through education and public policy - believing that this is the most valuable way to use academic expertise - Marcin is also a Founder and a Director of the think-tank Institute of Legal and Political Research and a member of Editorial Board of Res Publica Nova. Recently he became a Director of the Centre for Entrepreneurship at Nicolas Copernicus University.

He is the author of a book "Ku wolności jako odpowiedzialności", dozens of scientific papers and articles published in the country and abroad. He teaches classes in the field of jurisprudence, public law and global governance.
